Online Communications

- Choose wisely who you talk to and share information with online.
- Keep your personal information and passwords private.
- Report concerns to someone who can help to resolve problems.
- Use BIRD
 - B - block
 - I - ignore
 - R - report
 - D - delete

Handling the Hardware

- Handle equipment with care when using and moving around the school.
- Keep cords tucked away where no-one can trip on them.
- Store technology away safely and securely.

Trust

- Avoid pop ups and advertisements.
- Seek permission from an adult before any downloads or changes to settings.
- Log out and shut down properly.
- Personal devices remain off the network unless you have a signed BYOD form.
- Report any damages to an adult and student monitor immediately.

- Check that online sources are reliable - remember that all the information on the internet is not always correct.
